



# Children's Garden

Available at Gungahlin and Woden Cemeteries, the Children's Garden is a designated area for children up to and including the age of 12.

A Children's Garden allotment is a lawn grave, with memorialisation by way of a small headstone and/or plaque on the concrete beam at the head of the grave.

Interments can take place 7 days of the week.

The cost of the headstone and/or plaque is not included in the allotment fees.

Documentation will be issued post-burial and will include a list of stonemasons who can arrange headstone construction.

If a plaque is preferred instead of a headstone, Canberra Memorial Parks staff can assist you with the options.

In the interim period between the burial and memorialisation, a temporary grave marker will be provided.

Canberra Memorial Parks discourages any placement of personal, valuable or sentimental items on the site.



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# Frequently Asked Questions

## **Can we choose our own plaque?**

Yes. For the Children's Garden, Canberra Memorial Parks offers a range of plaques, and we invite you to visit our office at Gungahlin Cemetery to discuss options.

## **How long do we have to organise the plaque or headstone?**

Canberra Memorial Parks asks that, wherever possible, plaques and headstones are completed and installed within two years of the burial date.

## **Can we plant our own rose to memorialise our child?**

Yes. There is an opportunity to plant a small rose at the head of the grave. Advice on suitable varieties is available from Canberra Memorial Parks.

## **Do specifications apply to the building of the monument?**

Yes. Specifications are available from Canberra Memorial Parks on request.

## **Can we choose our own Stonemasons?**

Yes. Canberra Memorial Parks can provide you with a list of stonemasons to choose from.
