



Plaque Beam

Available at Gungahlin and Woden Cemeteries, a Plaque Beam allotment is a lawn grave, with memorialisation by way of a large plaque installed on the exposed aggregate beam at the head of the grave.

Graves are prepared to double depth. Most graves can be prepared to triple depth, which incurs an additional fee.

The first interment is included in the cost of the allotment. Subsequent interments will incur additional fees.

The memorial plaque is not included in the allotment fees and must be paid for separately at the time of need.

In the interim period between the burial and memorialisation, a temporary grave marker will be provided.

Interments can take place seven days of the week however additional fees may apply on the weekend.

Although fresh flowers are permitted at the Grave, Canberra Memorial Parks discourages any placement of personal, valuable, or sentimental items at the memorial.



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Frequently Asked Questions

Can I plant flowers on the grave?

No. The Canberra Memorial Parks caretakers oversee plantings and landscaping within the grounds, to ensure aesthetic and environmental appeal is maintained.

A small rose can be planted in the receptacle on the exposed aggregate beam at the top of the grave. This should be done in consultation with Canberra Memorial Parks.

Can I get a bigger plaque?

No. The design integrity of the site prohibits different plaque sizes to protect the overall appeal of the area.

Can I bury ashes in the grave

Yes. It is possible to inter ashes into an existing grave, however, this may be dependent on burials in the allotment and should be confirmed with Canberra Memorial Parks at the time of need.
